### **Update on Our Heating System**

As of the printing of this newsletter, we have been blessed to still have an operational furnace heating our place of worship, but as with everything, time takes over and things need to be replaced. Tim Stevens, our property manager, is in the process of getting quotes on a new heating system for the fellowship hall, kitchen, sanctuary, narthex and all adjoining rooms to the narthex hallway. This furnace will be quite costly. Over the spring and summer months, we will be asking our congregation to help us financially in order to get a new furnace in place before next winter. The estimation of a new heating system is in the range of \$35,000. If you would like to make a donation towards the new furnace, please include it in your weekly offering and designate an amount to go to the "furnace". We will be doing several fund drives over the next few months and providing "Building Fund - Furnace Replacement" envelopes in our bulletins. Please look for one in the future and help us keep our place of worship warm in the winter.

## Who's Asking for Money Now?

One thing you cannot say about St. Matthew is that we are short on asking for donations. From buying candy for the youth, money for missions, Scholarship fund, Gideon's, Jews for Jesus, Boy Scouts, Girls Scouts, to spaghetti dinners, pancake suppers and breakfasts, bake sales, Christmas gifts and food for the homeless plus many more, there are no shortage of giving opportunities. But let me say two things about this:

The first is that we assume when you give to these causes and organizations it is over and above what you have already committed to give to our ministry at St. Matthew. Please do not, as they say "rob Peter to pay Paul". We all must set giving priorities. We have commitments to our ministry that take precedence over giving to others. At the same time the bible teaches us to exercise sacrificial giving. That is giving over and above the tithe. God does expect us to be generous with others as he is to for us.

Secondly, as members we do have a primary obligation to support our ministry at St. Matthew but there is no obligation to support other ministries unless God directs you to do so. Most ministries outside the church promote along with their own solicitation that the local church tithe comes first. What we do asking for extra is provide you with opportunities to give to ministries that are worthy of support. We know when asking financial support that not everyone can or even desires to support these ministries outside our church. But the option is given for your deliberation.

So be thoughtful and generous in your giving but keep your giving potential and priorities in perspective.

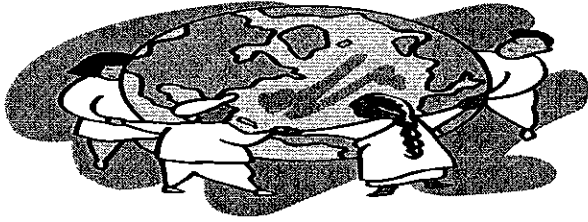

#### 2010 Ecuador Mission Trip is ON!!

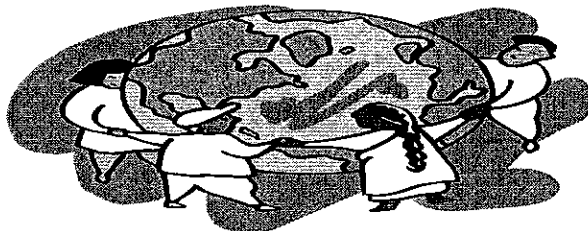

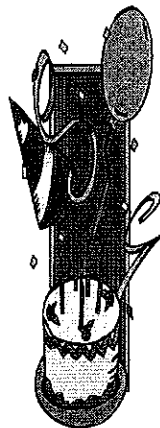
